A CALL FOR ACTION NOW

The Republican Party introduced its tax reform bill H.R.1 in the House of Representatives, and the general take on the proposed bill is that it will benefit the 1% rather than the middle class or those who need help. According to what is being reported, in addition to cancelling out the safety net of benefits those who need them the most, the tax reform bill will benefit those who do not need the tax cut.

As Unitarian Universalists in Arkansas we should speak out to our representatives in Congress and ask them to vote against the bill.

Please call or fax the Arkansas delegation in Congress and tell them you do not support the bill. Feel free to use your own language or use something like this:

“I am a voter in _____, Arkansas, and I am writing to tell you I oppose the Tax Reform bill H.R.1 just introduced into Congress by the Republican Party. I support the idea that government has a role to play in helping those in need; I support the idea that the richest individual people in the United States should pay more in taxes than the teachers, professionals, middle class, and the poor; I believe the richer should pay more, not less, than the middle class or the poor in real dollars and the percentage of their income.”

“The bill should reflect the values and ethics that promote the dignity and respect of all peoples, the environment, and the belief in lifelong education.”

“I urge you to work on a bipartisan bill to achieve common goals and ideals.”
